4. Action Research. This is an interesting qualitative research method in which the researcher and recipients have the same characteristics. Action data collection aims to solve a problem and is conducted by individuals working with others as part of a "community of practice". Qualitative research is used to understand how people experience the world. While there are many approaches to qualitative research, they tend to be flexible and focus on retaining rich meaning when interpreting data. Common approaches include grounded theory, ethnography, action research, phenomenological research, and narrative research.

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
