Fred Trueman was so much more than a cricketer legend. The book tells the story of two test match series: England vs West Indies in 1933 and West Indies vs England in 1935. The England team was one of the best to ever play the game. Their side including: Herbert Sutcliffe, Wally Hammond Harold Larwood and captained by Douglas Jardine had just battered Australia by 4:1 in the infamous bodyline series. Australians though regarded the bodyline series as a travesty: what was supposed to be a gentle game for gentlemen had been

turned into a struggle for dominance characterised by violence, intimidation and injury. The West Indian team, made up of from the populations of Britain's scattered possessions in the Caribbean and divided by race as well as island loyalties, seemingly, had little chance against Jardine's juggernaut. But cricket in the West Indies was more than just a game, the cricket field was a place where the island's black population could meet their white compatriots as equals in competition, competitions they often won.
