Anthony Barthelemy considers the influence of English political, social, and theatrical history on the depiction of black characters on the English stage from 1589 to 1695. He shows that almost without exception blackness was associated with treachery, evil, and ugliness. Barthelemy's central focus is on black characters that appeared in mimetic drama, but he also examines two nonmimetic subgenres: court masques and lord mayors' pageants. The most common black character was the villainous Moor. Known

for his unbridled libido and criminal behavior, the Moor was, Barthelemy contends, the progenitor of the stereotypical black in today's world. To account for the historical development of his character, Barthelemy provides an extended etymological study of the word Moor and a discussion of the received tradition that made blackness a signifier of evil and sin. In analyzing the theatrical origins of the Moor, Barthelemy discusses the medieval dramatic tradition in England that portrayed the devil and the damned as black men. Variations of the stereotype, the honest Moor and the Moorish waiting woman, are also examined. In addition to black characters, Barthelemy considers native Americans and white North Africans because they were also called Moors. Analyzing known nonblack, non-Christian men were characterized provides an opportunity to understand how important blackness was in the depiction of Africans. Two works, Peele's *The Battle of Alcazar* and Sotheby's *Oroonoko*, frame Barthelemy's study, because they constitute important milestones in the dramatic representation of blacks. Peele's *Alcazar* put on the mimetic stage the first

black Moor of any dramatic significance, and Sotheby's *Oroonoko* was the first play to have an African slave as its hero.

Among the other plays considered are Keker's *Lust Dominion*, Heywood's *The Fair Maid of the West*, Beaumont and Fletcher's *The Knight of Malta*, Marston's *Wonder of Women*, and Shakespeare's *Titus Andronicus* and *Othello*. In his provocative study of *Othello*, Barthelemy shows how stereotypical attitudes about blacks are initially reversed and how *Othello* is eventually trapped into acting in accordance with the stereotype. The first work to study the depiction of blacks in the drama of this period in a complete cultural context, *Black Face, Maligned Race* will be informative for anyone interested in the stereotypical representation of blacks in literature.

This unique book reveals the existence of an advanced civilization where none was known before, presenting an entirely new perspective on the culture and history of Tibet. Bellezza describes the vast network of castles, temples, megaliths, necropolises, and rock art established on the highest and now depopulated part of the Tibetan plateau. He relates literary tales of priests

and priestesses, horned deities, and the celestial afterlife to the actual archaeological evidence, providing a fascinating perspective on the origins and development of civilization. The story builds to the present by following the colorful culture of the herders of Upper Tibet, an ancient people whose way of life is endangered by modern development. Tracing Bellezza's epic journeys across lands where few Westerners have ventured, this book provides a compelling window into the most inaccessible reaches of Tibet and a civilization that flourished long before Buddhism took root.

*In Search of the Sorcerer's Apprentice* is the first book in English to be devoted to Lucian's *Philopseudes* or *Lover of Lies* (c. 170s AD). It comprises an extensive discussion, with full translation, of this engaging and satirical Greek text with its ten tales of magic and ghosts. One of these is the famous story of *The Sorcerer's Apprentice*, and this conveys the flavour of the rest. In other tales a plague of snakes is blasted with a miraculous scorching breath, a woman is drawn to her admirer by an animated cupid doll, and a haunted

house is cleansed of its monstrous ghost. *The Philopseudes* stands at the intersection of three of the liveliest fields in the study of antiquity: magic, traditional narratives, and the Lucianic oeuvre itself. Ogden's cross-fertilising expertise in all three of these fields enables him to build sophisticated analyses for each of the tales and to place them sensitively in their historical, cultural and literary contexts. Among the themes of the work are Lucian's methods of adapting motifs from traditional narratives, and the text's overlooked Cynic voice.

In 1872, a woman known only as "An Earnest Englishwoman" published a letter titled "Are Women Animals?" in which she protested against the fact that women were not treated as fully human. In fact, their status was worse than that of animals: regulations prohibiting cruelty against dogs, horses, and cattle were significantly more punitive than laws against cruelty to women. The Earnest Englishwoman's heartfelt cry was for women to "become-animal" in order to gain the status that they were denied on

the grounds that they were not part of "mankind." In this fascinating account, Joanna Bourke addresses the profound question of what it means to be "human" rather than "animal." How are people excluded from political personhood? How does one become entitled to rights? The distinction between the two concepts is a blurred line, permanently under construction.
