Yet, until now, it has never been proven. These doctrines rest on unsubstantiated assumptions. The book corrects decades of confusion and misguided research in corporate law and the economic theory of the firm and will allow readers to understand how property law, agency law, and economics contradict each other when applied to corporate law.
