 (SWAT) units by the
 year 2000 and
 suggests a strategy
 and planning system
 for making the best
 use of these new
 resources. The
 identification of
 technologies likely to
 be available to SWAT
 units by the year 2000
 was done through a
 "futures research"
 process initiated by a
 selected literature
 review and personal
 interviews with SWAT
 team experts. Various
 trends and potential
 events that could
 impact SWAT
 technology were
 forecast, and the
 information was used
 to develop three future
 scenarios, from which

a "desired future" was selected. Some trends considered were SWAT team use of nonlethal weapons, robotics in tactical situations, computer use in hostage negotiations and tactical situations, and communication technology for SWAT incidents. The study identified and analyzed individuals and groups known as "stakeholders," who have high interest in the desired future. It then developed the mission of law enforcement and SWAT and suggested three strategy alternatives, followed by the development of a planning system. A transition plan was created to bridge the gap between the present and the desired future.
