Muir also made four trips to Alaska and he documented these experiences in books *Travels in Alaska* and *The Cruise of the Corwin*. *Steep Trails* is collection of Muir's papers written during his journey over a period of twenty-nine years collected by William Frederic Badè. His activism helped to preserve the Yosemite Valley, Sequoia National Park and other wilderness areas. The Sierra Club, which he founded, is a prominent American conservation organization.
