Han pasado cuarenta años de las elecciones de 1977 y el mito de la transición se ha desmoronado. ¿Pero sabemos lo que ocultaba?. Este libro plantea que, entre 1968 y 1986, existió una ciudadanía luchando por una democracia real más allá del estado y los partidos y cuyas ideas, a veces, recuerdan a las del 15M. En la contracultura, política y cultura se unían radicalmente y la democracia era una nueva sensibilidad que lo afectaba todo: el amor, el trabajo, los cuerpos, el espacio público y el privado.
