Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated () was founded on January 13, 1913, at Howard University. Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated was first incorporated in Washington, D.C. on February 9, 1913. On January 20, 1930, the organization was incorporated as a perpetual body. The

nomenclature of graduate chapters are named according to geographic location and "Alumnae" annexed to the service area's name. The poem "Delta Girl" was written by honorary member Mary McLeod Bethune. The poem embodies the ideals of a Delta Sigma Theta woman. Delta Sigma Theta continues to Charter new chapters at both the Collegiate and Alumnae level. Delta Sigma Theta has more than 950 chapters located in the United States,

England, Japan (Tokyo and Okinawa), Germany, the Virgin Islands, Bermuda, Jamaica, The Bahamas, and the Republic of Korea. Chapters of Delta Sigma Theta are organized into seven regions and further sub-divided by state. At the turn of the twentieth century, black fraternities and sororities, also known as Black Greek-Letter Organizations (BGLOs), were an integral part of what W.E.B. Du Bois called the "talented tenth." This was the top ten percent of the black community that would serve as a cadre of educated, upper-class, motivated individuals who acquired the professional credentials, skills, and capital to assist the race to attain socioeconomic parity. Today, however, BGLOs struggle to find their place and direction in a world drastically different from the one that witnessed their genesis. In recent years, there has been a growing body of scholarship on BGLOs. This collection of essays seeks to push those who think about

BGLOs to engage in more critically and empirically based analysis. This book also seeks to move BGLO members and those who work with them beyond conclusions based on hunches, conventional wisdom, intuition, and personal experience. In addition to a rich range of scholars, this volume includes a kind of call and response feature between scholars and prominent members of the BGLO community.

This history of the largest
block women's
organization in the United
States is not only the
story of Delta Sigma
Theta Sorority (DST), but
also tells of the increasing
involvement of black
women in the political,
social, and economic
affairs of America.
Founded at a time when
liberal arts education was
widely seen as either
futile, dangerous, or
impractical for blacks,
especially women, DST is,
in Giddings's words, a
"compelling reflection of
block women's aspirations
for themselves and for
society." Giddings notes
that unlike other
organizations with racial
goals, Delta Sigma Theta
was created to change
and benefit individuals
rather than society. As a

sorority, it was formed to
bring women together as
sisters, but at the some
time to address the
divisive, often class-
related issues confronting
black women in our
society. There is, in
Giddings's eyes, a tension
between these goals that
makes Delta Sigma Theta
a fascinating microcosm
of the struggles of black
women and their
organizations. DST
members have included
Mary McLeod Bethune,
Mary Church Terrell,
Margaret Murray
Washington, Shirley
Chisholm, Barbara Jordan,
and, on the cultural side,
Leontyne Price, Lena
Horne, Ruby Dee, Judith
Jamison, and Roberta
Flack. In Search of

anecdotes told by the
Deltas themselves, and
illustrated with rare early
photographs of the Delta
women.

Barack Obama's speech on the Edmund Pettus Bridge to mark the fiftieth anniversary of the Selma
