The Domain Name System (DNS) enables user-friendly alphanumeric namesâ€"domain namesâ€"to be assigned

to Internet sites. Many of these names have gained economic, social, and political value, leading to conflicts over their ownership, especially names containing trademarked terms. Congress, in P.L. 105-305, directed the Department of Commerce to request the NRC to perform a study of these issues. When the study was initiated, steps were
