biography of the pastor of the Apostolic Faith Mission at 312 Azusa Street in Los Angeles, CA. Beginning in 1906, Seymour hosted a revival that spread the Pentecostal message around the world. In 1999 religious newswriters voted the Azusa Street revival as one of the ten most important religious events of the millennium. Seymour has been called the most influential

black religious leader in American history. Born in 1870 in Centerville, Louisiana, Seymour's parents were both former slaves. His father was a union soldier in the Civil War. Seymour was reared in the poverty and oppression of the reconstruction south. Seymour left the south and lived in Missouri, Indiana, Illinois and Ohio, usually working as a hotel waiter. He was

baptized as a Roman Catholic, converted in a Methodist Church, and then joined the Church of God Reformation movement. In 1905, he encountered Charles F. Parham in Houston, Texas and embraced the Pentecostal doctrine. Arriving in Los Angeles in February 1906, Seymour was locked out of the church that had called him to the city to preach. In April, a

Pentecostal outpouring led to the establishment of the mission on Azusa Street. Seymour spent his later years at the church in Los Angeles and traveling to spread the message. He died in 1922. The roots of the modern-day outpouring of the Spirit can be traced to a clapboard building during the turn-of-the-century in Los Angeles, California, Bishop Otis G. Clark became acquainted with Emma Mother of Azusa and Henry Cotton and lived in their home.

Clark arrived in Los Angeles in 1921 after the Tulsa, Oklahoma race riot. Mother Emma Cotton mentored Clark. He was her personal driver, while Henry her husband was a porter on the train going from city to city. They tried to keep the Azusa churches open. They visited churches in California and other states where Azusa churches started. At Azusa, the long services were

punctuated by fiery preaching, spontaneous singing and fervent praying. People were baptized with the Spirit, spoke in tongues, and fell under the power. Led by William J. Seymour, a Black Holiness preacher, Azusa attracted people of all colors and all walks of life. Whites, Blacks, Hispanics, and Asians together experienced the Spirit's manifest presence.

Seymour, who had received teaching on the Holy Spirit while listening through the doorway of an all-white classroom, knew his experience was for all people. It's a fact, some twenty-six major denominations, including the Assemblies of God, Four Square, Church of God in Christ, Church of God -Cleveland Tennessee, Apostolic Faith, United Pentecostal Church, and Pentecostal Assemblies of

the World, all trace their roots to the Azusa Street Revival; and 700 denominations, including independent denominations .Ambassadors Gwyneth Williams and Star Williams are blessed to have Bishop Otis G. Clark as father and grandfather. Seldom when a chronicle is written are the readers privileged to have "first-hand" information. Bishop Clark knew many of the original "saints" and now recalls

the events in the pages of this book. Join with me as we recount the events of the Azusa Mission. They are excited to have this privilege to retrace the roots of this move as we endeavor to complete what God started in 1906. Let us through these pages find the true spirit of Azusa, the spirit of unity. [Ignite Azusa](#) NYU Press William J. Seymour, the son of former slaves, was the founder and pastor of the famed

Azusa Street Mission in Los Angeles, California from 1906 until his death in 1922. Seymour was baptized in the Roman Catholic Church, converted in Methodism, sanctified in the Church of God Reformation movement, and then introduced to the Apostolic Faith or Pentecostal message in 1905. He took that message to Los Angeles in 1906. In addition to founding the mission at 312 Azusa Street,

Seymour traveled and helped to establish and organize other missions across the country. The Doctrine and Discipline was intended to be a policy and polity guide for all the Apostolic Faith Missions under Seymour's guidance. It contains sections on doctrine, the Christian family, the church, the ministry, and other subjects. Also included are forms that Seymour used for weddings, funerals, the

installation of church officers, and more. This is the only book ever written by Seymour. Published in 1915, the original book is extremely rare. This reprint makes the book available to the public for the first time in 85 years. Although Seymour's original thought is included, much of the book is a compilation from other church disciplines in the Wesleyan tradition. - Publisher.

Through William J Seymour, thousands would be baptized in the Holy Spirit with many receiving the gift of tongues as well as divine healing and freedom from demonic possession. "No instruments of

music are used. None are needed. No choir- the angels have been heard by some in the spirit. No collections are taken. No bills have been posted to advertise the meetings. No church organization is back of it.
