Innovation and entrepreneurship are not one and the same, although aspiring innovators often think of them that way. In *Innovating*, Luis Perez-Breva describes another approach—a doer's approach developed over a decade at MIT and internationally in workshops, classes, and companies. Perez-Breva describes how to create a kit for innovating, and outlines questions that will help you think in new ways. Finally, he shows how to systematize what you've learned: to advocate, communicate, scale up, manage innovating continuously, and document—"you need a notebook to converse with yourself," he advises.
