sapiens. What it means to have thoughts, and what gives us the remarkable capacity to think, have been subjects of debate for centuries. He follows the thread of mental development over the first 18 months of a baby's life to describe and to explain the emergence of thinking; he shares startling insights into mental development gained from his studies of autism; and he shows how, from infancy to adulthood, disturbances of thinking may be rooted in troubled early

relationships. Finally, he pinpoints tiny but momentous changes in the social relations of pre-human primates from which human thought sprang. In this fascinating and thought-provoking book, Peter Hobson shows how very early engagement with others fosters the child's growth out of the cradle of infancy and into the realm of human thought and culture.
